OUR MISSION

BALTIMORE CITY PRODUCE BOXES 24 POUNDS OF FRESH FRUITS & VEGETABLES FOR FAMILIES

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- SHA invites neighbors to reach out anytime for support or direction for how to access resources.
- Karen French and members of the SHA board from June until October picked up and distributed over 20 produce boxes of fruits and vegetables each week to neighbors who are in need. That program has ended and the SHA is actively looking for other ways to help.



PARK AND NEIGHBORHOOD CLEANUPS

- Even after the State of Emergency was announced, along with individual 'Friends of the park' doing weekly trash pickups, neighbors joined together every 2nd Thursday of the month to weed, pick up trash, and more! Tools are always available for those who would like to help.
- 6 trash grabbers were ordered by SHA and can be loaned out along with gloves for those who want to assist with trash pickup. Requests can be made via Next Door, and email.

TREES AND PLANTS IN SETON HILL

- In November, Carl Shapiro organized a tree planting in Seton Hill, and had a great turnout from community members as well as those across the City.
- Although the spring community tree planting had to be canceled because of the lockdown, Carl Shapiro & Zoe Hendrickson planted additional trees in April & May.
- In May, the Seton Hill Association was awarded a grant by Healthy Neighborhoods to expand tree wells on select streets and remove stumps. Thanks to Carl Shapiro and Dawnn McCleary for writing this grant. Join us for planting November 7!
- The Seton Hill Association has developed a tree pruning and maintenance plan for the years to come.
- Join TreeKeepers & Weed Warriors! Members of these groups are certified by the City to plant trees and manage native plants in City spaces. Contact Carl Shapiro or Zoe Hendrickson to learn more.



TREE DAMAGE

- Over a period of two nights in July, a person with unclear motives entered St. Mary's Park and inflicted severe damage on over a dozen trees.
- On Friday, July 17th, neighbors gathered together in the park to gather damaged limbs for mulching, and worked with Seton Hill Resident Carl Shapiro (who has been trained and is permitted by Baltimore City Rec and Parks to prune City-owned trees) to prune some of the snapped limbs on the trees to ensure that they would heal better with a cleaner cut.
- The Seton Hill Association board asks that all neighbors wishing to help prune damaged trees consult with the board in advance, as this type of pruning is not permitted without a special BCRP permit, and can unintentionally cause additional damage.
